R-20-01 Rezone DCH Montebello, LLC, property owner and applicant, seeks to rezone 5.3 acres fronting on the north side of State Route 53 and the west side of Jopena Boulevard (3528 Hwy. 53) (Map/Parcel 120/030) from C-1 (Neighborhood Business District) to C-2 (General Commercial Highway Oriented District). Proposed use: Commercial.

2. V-20-01 Variance, Heritage Group Homes, LLC, property owner and applicant, seeks a variance to the Hoschton Zoning Ordinance, Article VIII, "Zoning Amendments and Applications," Section 8.05 "Variances" paragraph (4) to allow for a variance to reduce the minimum required lot size, and a variance to Article IV, "Zoning Districts," Section 4.07, "OR, Office Residential District", paragraph 3, "dimensional requirements for agricultural and residential zoning districts" (Table 4.2) to reduce the required minimum lot size from 14,520 square feet to 10,000 square feet for 0.52 acre fronting on the south side of W.
